We can say 'a glass of water' or 'two bottles of water'.



# Types of Houses




Look at the pictures of different types of houses. Then fill in the blanks.

8. You can enter a Castle by walking over a short bridge called a drawbridge.




9. A Caravan is a house on wheels that you can drive from place to place.
